In order to attract the jobs it is essential that we make serious investments in our infrastructure (both hard and soft). Roads, water, and broadband are all integral to the growth of business. Additionally, we must improve our education system in West Virgina, both public and private. It has also become evident that we need more vocational education opportunities as many of our residents are in need of a new career as existing opportunities come to an end.

3. West Virginia is experiencing an economic recovery as we emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic. What will you support to continue, and accelerate, this economic recovery?

I would encourage an end to government "hand out" programs in favor of "hand up" options. Educational assistance for non-traditional students as well as supplemented on the job educational programs could be an excellent way to get our work force back to work. I see firsthand that many industries have a surplus of jobs and shortage of people, addressing this issue will encourage the economic recovery.

I support educational choice, we need to expand acceptability to other education options. Private school, home school, yo-tech, and charter schools all have a place in the growth of our children.
